Dr. James B. Hyman wins Board of Regents Award for Excellence in Public Service



The Board of Regents of the University of Maryland System selected BSU Assistant Professor, Dr. James B. Hyman, to be among 20 winners, state-wide, of its prestigious 2024 USM Faculty Award. Dr. Hyman received an award for Excellence in Public Service in recognition of his pioneering work in creating the BSU Philanthropy Initiative (BSUPI). As part of the Initiative, Dr. Hyman founded the BSU Philanthropy Fellowship Program which places BSU College of Business graduate students in 1-year, paid, full-time, C-suite placements in foundations and other nonprofit organizations. 82 percent of the students who completed the program secured positions in nonprofit organizations and 45 percent of them in foundations. To date he has raised more than \$3.5 million for the program. Testimonials sent to the Board of Regents, from his colleagues and students, attest to the excellence recognized by this award.

"Dr. Hyman is a significant contributor to the College of Business and Bowie State University because of his commitment to service, as well as teaching and research," said Dr. Lawrence McNeil in his recommendation to the Board of Regents. Recruiting external partners for the Initiative was the first step toward the realization of his dream – to establish Bowie State University as a major platform for Black excellence in the study, practice, and exploration of philanthropy and its impacts on the nonprofit organizations that serve Black and brown communities."
